## Festival 103

What a lot has happened, and not happened, since I wrote the introduction to the 2020 syllabus for Festival 102 in September 2019.

Having had to cancel the 2020 Festival at short notice just before the first COVID 19 lockdown we had hoped to organise some classes before the end of the year. This was impossible, as was a normal Festival in 2021. Plans were made, and then abandoned, for a variety of formats. However I reckon the Junior Instrumental and Vocal classes we are able to run in November 2021 can count as Festival 102.

In May we were saddened by the death of Nicky Jakeways. She joined the Festival Committee in 1985 and was Drama Secretary for many years until retiring in 2019. Her support for our young competitors and their teachers was always much appreciated. We will miss her beautiful verse speaking and unsurpassable readings from the works of Dickens, but most of all her kindness and smile.

Just two weeks later Bobbie Turton died. Joining the Committee in 2017 Bobbie had taken an increasingly active role following her retirement. These losses were difficult on a personal level, but also focussed our thoughts on the future of the Festival.

Dorothy Tyler who acted as Trophy Secretary for many years among her other contributions recently resigned from the Committee and Diana Awdry has given notice that this is her last year as Festival Treasurer. The greatest threat to the Festival's future is not a continuing or a new pandemic, but the reliance on a very small group of volunteeers who are not getting any younger!



To end on a more positive note, I look forward to welcoming you and our new President, Lady Proby to Festival 103. Accepting the role in 2020 Lady Proby wrote

"I am very pleased to be asked to become President of the Oundle Festival of Music & Drama and am delighted to be following in the footsteps of so many of my ancestors in being part of this organisation. I look forward to listening to many young and talented players and supporting a body which encourages and recognises their enthusiasm."

## **2022 ADJUDICATORS**

**Timothy Barratt** grew up in Peterborough and gained a scholarship to study at the Royal Academy of Music and later in Paris with Vlado Perlemuter. In addition to performing as solo pianist, accompanist and chamber music player, he has considerable experience of teaching at all levels.

He was a lecturer and vocal coach at the RAM and TCL for many years and is now Head of Keyboard at Dulwich College and a teacher at the Junior Academy.

He adjudicates for The British and International Federation of Festivals, directs workshops for teachers in the UK and abroad and is an ABRSM examiner, trainer, moderator and presenter, and a mentor for the Certificate of Teaching.

**Gabrielle Burgin Lister** brings a wealth of experience to her work as an adjudicator and wholeheartedly supports the principles of BIFF. She has a long Association with BIFF, serving as a deputy on the Adjudicators' Council, taking a major role as a compère at the 75th Anniversary celebrations and assisting with the new adjudicators programme.

Gabrielle studied at the Royal Manchester College of Music (now RNCM) with Ena Mitchell, winning the Jeanne Bretey Scholarship for Singing, and then privately in London with John Carol Case and Erich Vietheer. She worked as a Director of Music before taking up a freelance career as soprano soloist, visiting vocal specialist, and adjudicator. Festival work takes her all over the UK and abroad, and she is a regular visitor to the Hong Kong Schools Music Association Festival.

**Marcia Carr** is currently studying for her PhD. She trained in music, dance and drama, and currently facilitates workshops and directs shows for universities, drama schools and theatre departments. She has also toured internationally.

Marcia is Co-Artistic Director of Impetuous Kinship and Co-Director of the Creative Blast Company, delivering educational packages, training young people and producing shows touring internationally.

She's an Associate Artist with the National Youth Theatre of Great Britain, an Adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals and an Examiner for the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art, for which she has designed and delivered workshops.

**Paul Davies** founded Cambridge Chord Company, which under his direction won the Pavarotti Choir of the World at the Llangollen International Eisteddfod as well as six British and two European championships!

Paul qualified as a judge with the British Association of Barbershop Singers over 30 years ago and was recently awarded a place in the society's Hall of Fame and is currently involved in the Arts Council Making Music programme as a choral coach.

He has been principal coach to at least 12 gold medallist quartets as well as working as a choral educator with many larger groups. He is regularly invited to adjudicate at choral festivals in the UK, Europe and the USA.

Soprano soloist, choral conductor and voice teacher, **Elizabeth Emberson** began singing lessons with Betty Middleton when she was eleven years old. At eighteen she went to the Guildhall School of Music, where she studied with Joyce Newton and Anna Berenska, spending a year on the Opera Course there.

Whilst at the Guildhall she won the English Song Prize, was a semi-finalist in the Susan Longfield Award and gained several scholarships for further study.

On leaving the Guildhall, Elizabeth's singing career took her all over England, France and Eire before she decided to concentrate on her teaching career. She now teaches in Oxford, as well as maintaining a thriving private practice at home and she is an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals.

Nadia Hinson graduated from the Royal Academy of Music, having studied violin with Manoug Parikian and piano with Jean Harvey. Nadia was the featured soloist playing The Lark Ascending and Bach's Double Violin Concerto for the Benslow Trust at St. James' Piccadilly having been awarded an instrument to continue her studies.

She began her career as a freelance violinist. As an accompanist to singers and instrumentalists, she met her future husband and together they founded the Veloce Ensemble.

Nadia is the owner and director of the Hinson School of Music in Nottingham, and is an International examiner for the ABRSM, an adjudicator for BIFF, and a member of the Royal Society of Musicians. Nadia has recently been appointed a senior consultant for the LEAD Academy Trust, involved in developing music departments in schools in Nottinghamshire.

## SPEECH AND DRAMA COPYRIGHT

Oundle Festival subscribes to licences from the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society and the Copyright Licensing Agency.

The agreement with ALCS covers **performers** for the speaking of verse and prose items during the Festival. Dramatic items are not covered but solo monologues do not require copyright cover. If you intend to perform a duologue or group scene from a play you must contact the copyright owner directly, **before the entry is made.** 

Dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity, and the performer must not change the words or the gender of the character.

"Performers and teachers will be delighted to know that their participation in this Festival means that authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this Festival."

The CLA licence entitles the **Festival** to make photocopies of verse and prose provided we own an original copy of the licensed material and the copy does not exceed 5% of any item, ie 5% of the book or one chapter. These paper copies must not be sold.

Simple costume optional, no make-up, essential props only.

The title of the play/novel, author and publisher should be submitted at the time of entry. Your attention is drawn to the ALCS Copyright agreement on page 8.

\*Please ensure that performance piece is suitable for a family audience.\*

The final script, indicating cuts, must be sent to the Drama Secretary, clearly marked with class number and name, by March 23rd.

## Teachers: Please make these known to all entrants

- 1. No professional performer may compete. A professional is someone who derives his/her livelihood from the branch of performance, defined by the class title, in which she/he seeks to enter the Festival. In any ensemble, all members must adhere to that principle. This rule does not apply to conductors.
- 2. Age limits, where stipulated, apply to **January 1**st, **2022** and Year groups to the current school year of the competitor.

## The Children and Young Persons Act 1963 Section 37(3)(b)

**Schools** entering pupils must agree to use absence code **V** when entering and to provide details of the children participating and supervising adults for North Northamptonshire Council, as part of our Body of Persons Approval (BOPA), by **March 22**<sup>nd</sup> on the Group Participant Information form that will be sent to you.

**Private teachers and parents/carers** should be aware that your pupil/child will need a performance licence, **if they are not entered by their school**, should their class be scheduled in school hours. Application forms for a performance licence will be sent to the parents/carers of these competitors. See page 13 for further details.

- 3. Completed paper entry forms and fees to be sent to Entries Secretary no later than Thursday January 20<sup>th</sup> 2022. Online entry will close on Sunday January 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Festival is under an obligation to the Performing Rights Society to provide accurate details of all works performed. Therefore, it is vital that details of Own Choice items title, composer/author and publisher are given when entering.
- **4.** Late entries may be accepted if they can be fitted in after initial timetabling, and will be charged a double entry fee.
- **5.** No change to the original entry, either performer or own choice piece, is allowed without the prior permission of the organisers.
- **6.** A competitor may enter more than once in a Duet or Duologue Class provided that he/she performs a different piece and a different part or instrument.
- **7.** A piece must not be offered more than once by the same competitor for adjudication during the Festival or in consecutive years.
- **8.** Performers are encouraged to make use of the full time allocation for Own Choice classes, but their performance, including introductions, must not exceed the time limits stated.

- **10. Adjudicator's Copy.** Copies of all Own Choice items, including those for Grade Classes, **must be** brought to the Festival for the use of the adjudicator. Copies must be clearly marked with the competitor's name, class number and with the page number of the chosen piece.
- 11. Competitors requiring the Official Accompanist must state this when entering. Failure to comply means an accompanist will not be timetabled. All music for the Official Accompanist must be clearly labelled with the name of the competitor and class.

Music must be sent to the Music Secretary to arrive by **February 14**th **2022** so that the Official Accompanists may prepare for the Festival.

## **Notes on Music for Official Accompanists**

All copies for the Official Accompanists must be clear and legible. They should **not** be stapled or sellotaped together.

Transposing music downloaded from the internet is permitted, but it is often inaccurate and should be carefully checked for errors.

Transposing should only be done if absolutely necessary.

- **12.** Unauthorised photocopying is illegal. To comply with the code of Fair Practice, any photocopies brought for the use of the Adjudicator will be retained by the Committee and destroyed.
- **13**. CD backing tracks are **only** allowed for Drama performances.
- **14.** Photographing, videoing or recording by any means of Festival performances is not allowed.
- 15. The Committee reserves the right to accept or refuse any entry and its decision on any point is final.

The Committee accepts no responsibility for damage to or loss of instruments, music copies or personal property of any kind.

## Why you may need a Performance Licence?

In partnership with

Under the Children & Young Persons Act 1963, any public performance by a compulsory school age child may require a performance licence.

This is required if a performance meets any of the following criteria:

- requires time off from school i.e if the class your child is performing in requires them to have time off school and they are not part of a school group, then this will apply to you.
- it takes place on licensed premises e.g public house, club
- is broadcast, filmed or recorded for public exhibition this can be TV, internet, DVD
- performs for 4 or more days in rolling 6 month period
- · is being paid

It is illegal for the child to perform without a licence if any of the above apply.

However if your child is entered in a class that is

• after school or • at the weekend

then the Festival will include them on its Group Participant Information form, as required by our Body of Persons Approval (BOPA) contract with North Northamptonshire Council.

## **Child Protection Policy**

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This Policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

#### We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/youngperson is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- · working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

#### The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- · valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- · adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safeworking practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safeworking practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network quidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or quidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

## **Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone**

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create Safer Festivals for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival. Name: Gwen Radcliffe Phone: 01832 273191
- 3. Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection leaflets, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteer, including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival staff and volunteers wear a badge to identify their roles and all teachers/ parents/guardians /carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, performance, practice and changing areas that may be provided.
- 7. Please note that public toilets, the limited changing facilities and any practice rooms that may be available are not supervised by Festival stewards.
- 8. Care should be taken when crossing the road to move between Festival venues and facilities, which are spread round the centre of Oundle.
- 9. No unauthorised photography or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 10. Oundle Festival actively seeks to meet the special needs of participants notified to the Entry Secretary by parents, guardians or carers.

This should be done by contacting 01832 273191.

11. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and on our website.

By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.
